



ABMCRESCUE COMMITTEE

Please keep in mind that while we want our rescue dogs to receive good medical care, we have a very limited budget that we must stay within. Many vets will give discounts for rescue dogs. If your veterinarian does not give a discounted price for basic vet care for rescues, you might try calling your local rescue groups or SPCA to find a veterinarian that will. Expenses must be submitted to your ABMC Rescue Coordinator directly who will in turn send them to the ABMC Treasurer. The Treasurer will send your reimbursement check directly to you. You must send the coordinator the original receipts in order to be reimbursed.

Expenses that will be reimbursed:

- Rabies
- DHLPP
- Heartworm check (if dog is over 6 months old)
- Fecal check
- Heartworm medication (ask if you can purchase this monthly rather than purchasing a 6 month package)
- Worming medication (IF the fecal check comes back positive)
- Spay/Neuter (basic surgery, no preliminary bloodwork, no pain injections)
- Bordatella (kennel cough shot, ONLY if the vet clinic requires it for the dog to stay there and have surgery)
- Tattoo or microchip (whichever one is cheaper or whichever one is available at your vet clinic)
- Euthanasia fees (MUST first be approved by the Coordinator)

Expenses that will NOT be reimbursed:

- Lyme vaccine
- Supplements
- Bedding, collars, toys

Expenses that must be reviewed BEFORE they can be reimbursed (please notify your rescue coordinator immediately if any of the following vet care or transportation is needed):

- Heartworm treatment
- Hip surgery
- Boarding
- Any surgery besides spay/neuter
- Prescription medication
- Dog Food
- Transportation fees to foster homes (Transportation fees to permanent homes can not be reimbursed)
- X-Rays

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
